## <u>Deafness Support Network</u> (DSN)

DSN have clubs in Chester, Macclesfield, Warrington and Vale Royal, and offer services for children with hearing loss and their families, including;

Youth Vibe is a youth service for 8-18 year olds, led by Deaf, hearing impaired and hearing young people. The local groups meet regularly to socialise and participate in a wide range of activities.

'DSN I'm Hear' offers support to children with hearing loss and their families within the home, for example with communication and deaf awareness.

**DSN Social Care** team provides specialist support such as counselling, help and advice on benefits, information about services and advice on technical equipment.

DSN also run British Sign Language courses and are looking into offering lip-reading classes depending on levels of interest
